BRITISH CHAMPION, IMPRESSED WITH TONYA, TO VISIT PORTLAND

Arthur Apfel, British Figure Skating Champion in 1946 and World Bronze Medalist in 1947, recently saw one of Tonya's greatest victories—Skate America International in 1991—on television and was quite impressed! Mr. Apfel, who finished behind Hans Gerschwiler and Dick Button at the Worlds in 1947, is visiting Portland in August. "I was so thrilled by the skating of the winner, Tonya Harding," Mr. Apfel wrote. "What a magnificent triple Axel!"

The Fan Club is planning a special reception to honor the meeting of these two National Champions and World Medalists. Tonya is eagerly looking forward to the occasion—and so apparently is Mr. Apfel, who wrote this postscript: "P.S.: Triple Axel and POW! perfectly landed!" Might we see a pair of champions skating together, bridging the generations? Stay tuned.

TONYA TO SPEAK AT YOUTH CONFERENCE

Impressed with Tonya during a recent speech our friend made before the Southwest Rotary Club here in Portland, Rotary International has invited Tonya to address the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (R.Y.L.A.) to be held in July at the Menucha Retreat Center at Corbett, Oregon. R.Y.L.A. is a week-long conference of young people, 18 to 25 years of age, who hold positions of leadership or display leadership potential. "R.Y.L.A. trains and encourages selected individuals in effective and dynamic leadership strategies with an emphasis on communication skills and interpersonal relationships," according to official literature. "R.Y.L.A. brings together individuals from different cultures, educational levels and work experiences with noted community professionals to interact, learn and discuss challenges and opportunities for future leaders."

This is a wonderful opportunity for young people with "the right stuff" to visit with a young woman who has come through much adversity to reach the pinnacle of her career field!

ICE CAPADES CHALET, Clackamas Town Center—It's summertime and Tonya Harding is hot, hot, hot! Tonya is working on her new short (technical) and long (freestyle) programs for the upcoming competitive year and she is practicing some very interesting triple/triple jump combinations.

As I sit at rinkside every morning, sipping my coffee-of-the-day and watching Tonya skate, I am reminded of Scott Hamilton's comment during the 1991 telecast of Skate America International: "Tonya warms up doing double Axels!" He is absolutely right. After a few spins it's the first jump she usually does. Recent days have been no different except now Tonya also warms up on triple jumps and afterwards works on triple/triple combinations. Does this mean that instead of Tonya being considered a "triple threat" she will become a "triple/triple threat"? What this reporter has seen is that Tonya's triple jumps are becoming very consistent, including that trademark triple Axel of hers. Maybe consistency will become a pleasant side-effect of working on so many "combination" jumps.

Which triple jump combinations have been performed by our little blond dynamo (you may ask)? This reporter observed Tonya practice *four* different triple/triple combinations. The first was the triple toe/triple toe combination. The second was the double Axel/triple toe combination. Continuing in the "combo" department was the third jump—the triple flip/triple toe combination followed by her new triple loop/triple loop combination. I continue to be in awe of Tonya's execution of this last combination.

For those of you who may have trouble distinguishing one triple jump from another, the loop jump is not a toe-assisted jump like the Lutz, toe or flip. It is an edge (right back outside) jump and one which I find easier to spot as Tonya's legs are actually *crossed* on the backwards springing take-off to the loop from the right foot. The amazing part is watching Tonya complete two triple loop jumps back-to-back (!). Next time you are at the rink, watch for this and

 - 9. Helped her with phone calls, letters, errands, etc.
- 10. Arranged with Pay Less Drugs (through them and the U.S.F.S.A.) for them to underwrite her medication.
- 11. Arranged her appearance before a local middle school assembly, so she could present the students with the Fan Club's donation to the school's "penny drive" for new equipment.

A very nice gentleman from Amherst, New York—a brand-new Fan Club member, David Dunaj—has come up with a wonderful idea! Besides his membership and a substantial donation (thanks, David), he is pledging \$10 a month to the Fan Club (see article elsewhere in this edition of **The Skater**) and he challenges other members to do the same, *especially those in education* which is his field. Don't Forget Tonya's Early Victories

To the Editor:

Your headline announcement (The Skater; Volume One, Number Two; May, 1993) of Tonya's return to Skate America International was most welcome news. I also agree that 1991 was one of her greatest triumphs. Nevertheless, I think mention should be made of Tonya's other Skate America achievements.

The 1986 Skate America in Portland, Maine, really helped Tonya gain national recognition. At first this didn't seem likely. Tonya came out of the compulsory figures in 8th place. She might have been higher but for an unexpected distraction from the referee at the start of her loop. Many a competitor might have been daunted, but not Tonya. Tiffany Chin hung on for the gold. But it was Tonya who won both the short and long programs for the silver medal.

At the Exhibition of Champions, Tonya received by far the most flowers, which she lifted high in a giant bouquet salute to the audience.

Tonya was passed over for Skate America during the next two years. In the meantime she went on to win gold at the 1987 La Coupe d'Excellence in Montreal and the 1988 Moscow News Event.

Indianapolis in 1989 saw Tonya's return to Skate America and a head-to-head duel with Jill Trenary. Not intimidated by Trenary's status as a then two-time national champion, Tonya gained the lead in the short program. In the long program her triple Axel attempt was singled. But Tonya's program was of such quality as to earn a standing ovation and the gold medal.

Tonya has set a standard of excellence for Skate America International. I look forward to seeing her new programs in Dallas. She'll be superb!

I've seen Tonya complete the triple Axel four times in two days' time and my jaw still drops down-about as far as her jump is high (Well, not quite that far down, as Tonya's triple Axel is quite high!)—every time I see it. It is nothing short of awesome. The height she gets on her triple Axel is unbelievable! Television cameras sure don't pick up the magnitude of that jump. In my humble opinion, Tonya is the real "trail blazer" on ice here in Portland.

By the way, if you think you see a new bundle of energy on the ice these days, you are probably seeing Tonya sporting her new hairdo. At first, I didn't immediatelly recognize her myself (she hadn't begun her practice) until she came up to the editor and myself at rinkside and said, "Hi!" Tonya is letting her bangs grow. Her hair continues to be drawn back into a pony-tail, but without bangs on her forehead. Sodon't get discouraged if you don't immediatelly recognize Tonya from afar, because there's a "new" Tonya
